The motto of MongoliAid International is 'making the world a better place, one Mongolia at a time'. For the Stark family (from the Atherton Tablelands) Batsumber is just one district in Mongolia to start from.

One of the problems facing Mongolia today is water and sanitation. The water on the surface freezes up during winter, so underground water resources are required. In Batsumber alone there are no paved streets, no sewer system and 6,000 people.

UNCANNY FOOD SWAP By Deanna Maich

Anyone who saw the film 'Food Inc' at the Majestic Theatre last Sunday will be keen to jump on the fruit and veg bandwagon that LETS member, Sharyn Jones is suggesting. It's simple and about sharing our excess, backyard produce.

Ms Jones, of LETS (Local Exchange Trading System) says "I am passionate about this, with so many people in the world in drought and famine, we are so lucky to live in such a beautiful and fruitful area, it is upsetting to see fruit falling on the ground and being wasted"

Rather than reinvent the wheel, Sharyn says LETS already has the infrastructure to enable Tablelanders and beyond to share backyard goodies. "I have been inspired by an article I came across on the Gardening Australia website and thought that would definitely fit into our model. Anyone who has excess fruit, vegies or herbs they'd like to share but can't or don't have the time, could contact us and we can try to get someone else, who perhaps needs or wants produce, to trade to go around and pick it for them"

Ms Jones has been investigating the Urban Orchard/ Community Harvest type model. Ceres, the Melbourne community garden and non-profit organisation has also inspired her. "I went on their website and the whole idea fits in with the Permaculture concept as well, which encourages everyone to produce what they can in their own backyards and then it takes it a step further to share any surplus which helps to expand their harvest by swapping with the others in the community"

This green thumbed community member has a trade meeting at her place once a month where people have the chance to share a meal and trade, "Everybody brings a plate. It's very informal and very social.", says Ms Jones.

Other trade meetings are held in Tarzali Ravenshoe, Malanda and Yungaburra after the markets.

"People can bring anything they want to dispose of, that still has some life in it and swap it for something else" adds the share-harvest advocate.

To clean up that carpet of grapefruit laying below your oh-so-giving tree, and get involved in reducing your carbon footprint, ring Sharyn Jones 07 4091 7242/0407 776 147. Last year two young members of the Stark family, Emily and Georgia, held a 'Mega Mammoth MongoliAid' garage Sale in Atherton and raised over \$5500. Together with SAM (the Scout Association of Mongolia), the 'Clean water and clean nature' project was born and 10,120 US dollars was raised to cover the cost of building a well for the Batsumber people.

Their well was drilled by a six drilling team and is 66 metres deep. It has been fitted with a water pump, a water filter, has a five ton capacity water tank and a protection house to safe guard it from floods. It was christened by 1200 participants at the fourth National Scout Jamboree, and is currently supplying 6000 Mongolians with clean safe drinking water.

Additionally, 2000 blankets from North Queensland have been trucked down south to Brisbane. Along with the 3000 already stored there, they will be shipped to Mongolia before Christmas (with medical text books and medical equipment). They'll need them too. From mid-October until about mid-May temperatures drop to around -30°C and below!


